What is a Comma Splice?



A comma splice is a type of punctuation error that occurs when two independent clauses (i.e., complete sentences) are joined together with just a comma, without a coordinating conjunction (such as "and," "but," or "or") or a semicolon.

For example: I went to the store, I bought some apples.



Independent Clause Independent Clause

In this sentence, "I went to the store" and "I bought some apples" are both independent clauses, but they are joined together with only a comma. A correct way to join these two clauses would be to use a coordinating conjunction:

I went to the store, and I bought some apples.



Or a semicolon:

I went to the store; I bought some apples.



Here are some more examples of comma splices and how to fix them. It should be noted that semicolons (though a solution to fixing a comma splice), are a much less common method than simply adding a coordinating conjunction.

I want to go to the movies, I don't have any money."

Correction: Use a semicolon or add a coordinating conjunction to join the two independent clauses.

I want to go to the movies, but I don't have any money.



I want to go to the movies; I don't have any money.

She loves to read books; her favorite author is Jane Austen.
Another example:
I'm going to the beach, I'm going to swim in the ocean. Independent Clause Independent Clause
Correction: Use a semicolon or add a coordinating conjunction.
I'm going to the beach, and I'm going to swim in the ocean.
I'm going to the beach; I'm going to swim in the ocean.
