


Imagery is a technique writers use to create vivid pictures in your mind by appealing to your senses-sight, sound, touch, taste, and smell. When you read something with strong imagery, you can almost see, hear, feel, taste, or smell what the author is describing.

For example, instead of saying "The garden was beautiful," a writer might use imagery and say,

"The garden was bursting with vibrant flowers of red, yellow, and purple, and the air was filled with the sweet scent of roses." This description helps you imagine the scene more clearly.
