What is a metaphor?

A metaphor is a way of describing something by comparing it to something else, without using the words "like" or "as." It helps make a description more vivid or interesting.



For example, if you say "<u>The classroom was a zoo</u>," you're using a metaphor. You don't mean that the classroom literally had animals in it; you're saying that the classroom was noisy and chaotic, just like a zoo.
