The prefix "re-" is of Latin origin and is used to indicate repetition or again. It is commonly added to verbs and, in some cases, nouns to create new words that convey the idea of doing something again or returning to a previous state.

For example:

- Revisit: To visit or look at something again.
- Recreate: To create something again or in a similar way.
- Reread: To read a text again.

- Recover: To regain something that was lost or return to a healthy state.
- Rebuild: To construct or build something again.
- Reintroduce: To introduce something again or bring it back.
- Repetition: The act of repeating something.
- Recharge: To refill or renew the energy or power of something.
