Write a story using the sentence prompts below — each one asks you to do something different. Let each sentence build tension, reveal character, or deepen mystery.

**Sentence 1** — Begin with a **Sound**: Start your story with a sound (real or imagined). Example: "A low hum buzzed beneath the floorboards."

Sentence 2 — Reveal a Character Trait Indirectly: Describe something your character does that reveals who they are or how they feel.

Example: "He double-checked the lock — again." (This shows the character might be anxious or paranoid without directly saying it)

Sentence 3 — Use a Vivid Color or Texture: Include a sensory detail with color, texture, or both. Example: "The velvet curtain was blood-red and soft as ash."

**Sentence 9** — Use a **Dash** for Emphasis: Create suspense or a twist using a dash in your sentence. <u>Example: "She opened the drawer — and froze."</u>

**Sentence 10** — End with a **Visual Image**: Leave the reader with a striking image, as if the story stopped on a snapshot.

Example: "The hallway was empty - except for the boots facing the door."
