# “Guess the Country” Story Challenge

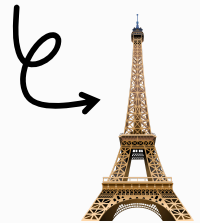
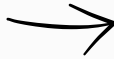


Write a 10-sentence story set in a country of your choice—but don't name the country.

Your goal is to use vivid language, cultural clues, and descriptive details to bring the story and your country to life. Follow the sentence-by-sentence structure below. When you are finished writing, you will read your story to the class - and your classmates will guess your country.

**Sentence 1:** Set the scene. Describe the **setting** using sensory details—what can be seen, heard, smelled, or felt.

**Sentence 2:** Introduce your **main character**.



**Sentence 3:** Add a **simile or metaphor** to describe something in the story.

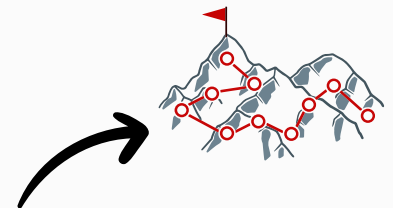
**Sentence 4:** Show what the **character is doing or wants to do**. Include a **reference to a real place, food, or activity from your chosen country** (but do not name it).



**Sentence 5:** Include **dialogue**. Let your character or another person speak.

**Sentence 6:** Mention a **local tradition, custom, or cultural reference**—but don't name it directly.

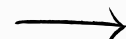
**Sentence 7:** Write a sentence that is between **12 and 15 words** long.



**Sentence 8:** Use **one** of the following words: **ancient, celebration, journey, or mystery**.

**Sentence 9:** Include an **emotion word** (e.g., nervous, joyful, frustrated, peaceful).

**Sentence 10:** End with a **twist or surprise** that adds a fun or unexpected detail.
