Vocabulary Options: ephemeral, cacophonous, palpable, luminous, acrid


**Sentence 2:** Introduce a character using a sophisticated adjective.

Vocabulary Options: astute, idiosyncratic, enigmatic, audacious, meticulous



**Sentence 3:** Describe the **setting** in a vivid or unusual way.

Vocabulary Options: labyrinthine, decrepit, opulent, surreal, barren



**Sentence 4:** Present a **major problem, complication, or unexpected development**.

Vocabulary Options: conundrum, obliterated, infiltrated, derailed, fragmented

**Sentence 5:** Use a **metaphor or simile** to convey the **character's emotional state**.

Vocabulary Options: despondent, exasperation, euphoria, dread, fortitude



**Sentence 6:** Show the character taking **action or making a bold decision**.


Vocabulary Options: persevered, commandeered, implored, retaliated, circumvented

Vocabulary Options: paradox, divulged, metamorphosis, foreshadowed, clandestine

Vocabulary Options: silence, thunder, moonlight, mist, architecture



**Sentence 9:** **Resolve the conflict** or offer a turning point.

Vocabulary Options: reconciled, vanquished, vindicated, deciphered, restored

**Sentence 10:** End with a **reflective or thought-provoking conclusion**.

Vocabulary Options: epiphany, reverence, ambiguity, resolve, legacy
