Writing Challenge: “The Wildest Weekend Ever” (Alliteration Edition)

Write a 10-sentence story about a weekend that was full of wild, wacky, or weird events.

Your mission: Use **at least 5 examples of alliteration**—repeating the same starting sound in a series of nearby words.

Sentence 1: Start with a **catchy sentence** that sets the tone using **alliteration**.

Example: Saturday started with a ssuspicious squirrel stealing my ssandwich.



Sentence 2: Describe **where you were** and what was happening.

Example: I was walking through the woods when the weirdness began.

Sentence 3: Add a problem that feels a little ridiculous or unexpected.

Example: My shoes squeaked, slipped, and sank into sticky, squishy mud.



Sentence 4: Use **alliteration to describe your reaction**.

Example: I screamed, scrambled, and sprinted—soggy and stunned.

Sentence 5: Add a line of **dialogue**.

Example: “Seriously?” I shouted. “Slippery socks and soggy ssandwiches?!”

Sentence 6: Include a **new challenge or twist** in the story.

Example: A flock of flapping flamingos flew across the field.



Sentence 7: Write a sentence with **exactly six words**.

Example: Everything felt fast, funny, and fake.

Sentence 8: Begin with “**Even though...**” and show how you kept going.

Example: Even though my pants were plastered in pine needles, I pressed on.

Sentence 9: Use another strong example of **alliteration with action**.

Example: I finally flopped face-first into fluffy ferns.



Sentence 10: End with a **fun or surprising reflection**.

Example: Next weekend, I think I’ll stay safely snuggled in bed.
