## Silly Sentence Starters: Alliteration Edition

**Alliteration** is when two or more words close together begin with the same sound or letter—especially consonants. It's often used in poems, tongue twisters, and creative writing to make language more rhythmic, catchy, or dramatic.

### Examples of Alliteration:

**Gary the goose guzzled grape soda and giggled goofily.**



The repeated "g" sound is an example of alliteration.

**Silly squirrels sang songs about spaghetti on Saturn.**



The repeated "s" sound is also an example of alliteration.

### Objective:

Students will practice writing alliterative sentences by finishing silly sentence starters that already begin with repeating sounds. This builds creativity, vocabulary, and a sense of play with language.
