# 10-Sentence Story Challenge: Rudolph vs. Frosty — Legendary Winter Clash



**Sentence 1:** Micro-Moment (5 words or fewer):

Create a tiny, explosive opening that signals trouble.  
(e.g., Rudolph secretly hated Frosty.)

**Sentence 2:** Foreshadowing Sentence:

Hint that Rudolph or Frosty senses something is wrong.



**Sentence 3:** Alliteration Sentence:

Use at least four words that start with the same letter  
(e.g., "Frosty formed a frozen fortress.")

**Sentence 4:** Compound Sentence:

Reveal the first sign of mischief from Frosty or Rudolph using for, and, nor, but, or, yet, or so.

**Sentence 5:** Include an exclamation point.

A dramatic emotional burst.

(e.g., Rudolph knew one thing: Frosty was a liar!)



**Sentence 6:** Simile or Metaphor Sentence:

Compare Rudolph's glowing nose, Frosty's icy magic, or the showdown itself to something vivid.  
(e.g., Frosty's cold power coiled around Rudolph like the grip of winter itself.)

**Sentence 7:** Onomatopoeia Sentence:

Use at least one sound word to bring the scene to life (e.g., crunch, boom, jingle, scrape)  
(e.g., "Crack! The frozen ground split beneath them.")



**Sentence 8:** Dialogue

Have Rudolph or Frosty say something to the other.

(e.g., "The end is near for that red little nose of yours," Frosty mocked Rudolph.)

**Sentence 9:** Start with a Participial Phrase (-ing):

Show the battle escalating with strong imagery.

(e.g., "Charging through the glimmering snowflakes.")



**Sentence 10:** Symbolic Ending:

End with a symbol (light, ice, snowflake, warmth, shadow, etc.) that reveals who won—or what changed.
