Write a 100-word story or dialogue about any topic you choose.

Your challenge is to blend in at least three popular song lyrics so they fit naturally into your writing.

Yes—this means dropping three real song lyrics into your story or conversation without making them obvious. If you get stuck, don't stop believing—just keep writing.

When you're finished, be ready to share your piece with a partner or the class. Your audience will try to identify where you used the song lyrics.
