# 100th Day of School Writing Challenge



You have officially reached the 100th day of school. Write a 10-sentence paragraph reflecting on how far you've come and what you want to accomplish for the rest of the year.

## **Sentence 1** – Emotion (The Moment):

Capture how it feels to reach the 100th day of school in a single, clear sentence.



## **Sentence 2** – Simile (Looking Back):

Compare the first 100 days of school to something else using “like” or “as.”

## **Sentence 3** – The Challenge:

Describe your school year so far as a journey, object, or challenge you've been facing.



## **Sentence 4** – The Number Rule:

Use the number 100 in a meaningful way to show your effort, growth, or progress.

## **Sentence 5** – Personification (School or Time):

Give school, time, or the year a human action or feeling.



## **Sentence 6** – Rhetorical Question (The Turn):

Ask a thoughtful question about what you want to improve or change after day 100.

## **Sentence 7** – Goal Sentence (Power Verbs):

State one goal for the rest of the year using at least two strong action verbs (examples: build, sharpen, push, focus, challenge, commit).



## **Sentence 8** – Alliteration (Focus & Effort):

Use alliteration to describe how you'll stay motivated or focused going forward.



## **Sentence 9** – Growth Mindset:

Show that effort, practice, or mistakes will help you improve from day 101 on.

## **Sentence 10** – Forward Finish:

End with a confident or hopeful sentence about who you will be by the last day of school.



## Example

**Sentence 1:** Reaching the 100th day makes me feel proud, tired, and a little surprised at how far I've come.

**Sentence 2:** The first 100 days of school were like climbing a steep hill that slowly leveled out near the top.

**Sentence 3:** This school year has felt like carrying a heavy backpack that gets lighter every time I learn something new.

**Sentence 4:** After 100 days of trying, failing, and trying again, I can finally see real growth in my effort and focus.

**Sentence 5:** School nudges me forward each morning, even when I feel stuck or unmotivated.

**Sentence 6:** Now that I've reached day 100, what habits should I change to become a stronger student?

**Sentence 7:** From here on, I will focus, practice, and push myself to do better every day.

**Sentence 8:** I plan to stay determined, disciplined, and driven when things get difficult.

**Sentence 9:** Even when I make mistakes, I know that effort and practice will help me improve after day 101.

**Sentence 10:** By the last day of school, I will be more confident, capable, and ready for whatever comes next.
